

Infant Baptism: Celebrated on the second and fourth weekend of each month; Saturday at 3:00 p.m. or Sunday following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Deacon Jim (757-898-5570). Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

Confirmation: This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the RCIA process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated with a personal visit to a home or care facility so that family and friends may be present.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

UNIVERSAL SALVATION AND THE IDEA OF PILGRIMAGE

Reflection on Matthew 2:1-12

The Feast of the Epiphany offers us such a wealth, a richness of images and themes to feed our faith, engage our imaginations, and empower us in our walk with the Lord. Two major themes to explore are the universality of Salvation, and the idea of journey, or pilgrimage.

God's saving concern for humanity is all-inclusive; Salvation is not just intended for the Jews, but for all peoples of the earth, represented by the visit of the Magi. Since the gift of God in Jesus is to transcend all boundaries, since God's concern and intent for the Salvation of the human race is global and unbiased, how are we, who have accepted this gift of Salvation in Christ, cultivating a similarly universal and all-inclusive acceptance of and care for one another?

The Magi tracking the star to Bethlehem, and the cavalcade of nations streaming toward the illumined Jerusalem, represent the idea of journey, of pilgrimage. We, too are on a pilgrimage, drawing toward the light to experience the longing of all hearts, the meaning of all life, the power of all love, in our encounters with Jesus. Like the Magi who took a different direction after their encounter, we too are continually challenged to transformation and change in our encounters.

SAINT BASIL THE GREAT

Feast Day: January 2 • Patron of Russia

Basil was on his way to becoming a famous teacher when he decided to begin a religious life of Gospel poverty. After studying various modes of religious life, he founded what was probably the first monastery in Asia Minor. He is to monks of the East what Saint Benedict is to the West, and Basil's principles influence Eastern monasticism today.

He was ordained a priest, assisted the archbishop of Caesarea – now southeastern Turkey – and ultimately became archbishop himself, in spite of opposition from some of the bishops under him, probably because they foresaw coming reforms.



Arianism, one of the most damaging heresies in the history of the Church, which denied the divinity of Christ, was at its height. Emperor Valens persecuted orthodox believers, and put great pressure on Basil to remain silent and admit the heretics to Communion. Basil remained firm, and Valens backed down. But trouble remained. When the great Saint Athanasius died, the mantle of defender of the faith against Arianism fell upon Basil. He strove mightily to unite and rally his fellow Catholics who were crushed by tyranny and torn by internal dissension. He was misunderstood, misrepresented, accused of heresy and ambition. Even appeals to the pope brought no response. "For my sins I seem to be unsuccessful in everything."

Basil was tireless in pastoral care. He preached twice a day to huge crowds, built a hospital that was called a wonder of the world – as a youth he had organized famine relief and worked in a soup kitchen himself – and fought the prostitution business.

Basil was best known as an orator. Though not recognized greatly in his lifetime, his writings rightly place him among the great teachers of the Church. Seventy-two years after his death, the Council of Chalcedon described him as "the great Basil, minister of grace who has expounded the truth to the whole earth."

As the French say, "The more things change, the more they remain the same." Basil faced the same problems as modern Christians. Sainthood meant trying to preserve the spirit of Christ in such perplexing and painful problems as reform, organization, fighting for the poor, maintaining balance and peace in misunderstanding.

Our legacy refers to the portion of all we have from God which we thankfully give back once He calls us to glory. The goal of a legacy is to leave a gift that will make an impact for future generations.
