#### **SACRAMENTS**

*Infant Baptism:* Celebrated on the second and fourth weekend of each month; Saturday at 3:00 p.m. or Sunday following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Deacon Jim (757-898-5570). Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

*Confirmation:* This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the RCIA process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated with a personal visit to a home or care facility so that family and friends may be present.

*Sacrament of Marriage:* Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

#### FIRST AND FOREMOST, A BELOVED CHILD OF GOD

Reflection on Mark 10:46-52

"Many rebuked him, telling him to be silent." Such is the response of some in the crowd as they react to the blind beggar, Bartimaeus, calling out to Jesus. Have you ever received that message from someone or some group of people? Either overtly or in a more subtle way, so many on the margins, so many of our young people, are told to be quiet, to make themselves scarce, not to call attention to themselves and their legitimate needs.

When Jesus tells Bartimaeus that his faith has saved him, perhaps He was referencing the beggar's persistence, his determination to find his voice and make it heard, his insistence that carrying his desires/prayers to Jesus in personal encounter will surely result in a showering of grace, his courage in going against the "many" who just want him to go away and stop irritating them.

For faith is like that. When Jesus encounters the faith of Bartimaeus and of so many others in the Gospel stories, He highlights the fact that they are, first and last, His beloved children. Faith is knowing, in the depth of your being, that you are loved by God. When you have this gift, you can approach the Divine as a child, with any request, and you will be heard.

### ST. JUDE THADDEUS

Feast Day: October 28 • Patron Saint of Lost Causes

Iude's father was a martyr, and his mother kindly stood at the cross and anointed Christ's body after His death. He was actually the nephew of Mary and Joseph, and it is said that he looked very much like his cousin Jesus. His patronage of impossible causes stems from confusion between him and Judas. Since early Christians prayed for Judas' help, and not Jude Thaddeus, devotion to Jude was "a lost cause." Iude was killed with a club and beheaded after his death in Persia during the first century. His relics were distributed in Rome and France.




