SACRAMENTS

Infant Baptism: Celebrated on the second and fourth weekend of each month; Saturday at 3:00 p.m. or Sunday following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Deacon Jim (757-898-5570). Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

Confirmation: This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the RCIA process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated with a personal visit to a home or care facility so that family and friends may be present.

Sacrament of Marriage: Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

Christ is always present to his Church, especially in the actions of the liturgy. He is present in the sacrifice of the Mass, in the person of the minister (it is the same Christ who formerly offered himself on the cross that now offers by the ministry of priests) and most of all under the Eucharistic species. He is present in the sacraments by his power, in such a way that when someone baptizes, Christ himself baptizes. He is present in his word, for it is he himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in the Church. Finally, he is present when the Church prays and sings, for He himself promised: Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst.

Reflection on Luke 6:27-38

This Gospel passage, with its many exhortations, may express what is most radical, and difficult, about Jesus' message. It strikes many as counterintuitive, as it confronts us at the core of how we relate to one another. The world will guide the relationships we have as human beings with the principle of reciprocity: protect yourself from others by deploying a good defense; retaliate when attacked; take an eye for an eye.

With Jesus we have a whole new ethic to guide our relationships, and it is only possible to live it with the grace of the Holy Spirit. No more tit-for-tat stuff. Ask yourself what you want people to do for you, then grab the initiative and do it for them. Let everyone, even enemies, bring out the best in you. With difficult people, respond with the energies of prayer for them. Use every occasion to practice the servant life.

Act toward all others as God acts toward you – with kindness, forgiveness, generosity, mercy, love. In today's divisive world, what would happen if we Christians took this message to heart and lived it? Let's do it and find out!

SAINT WALBURGA

Feast Day: February 25

Patron of Those Caught in Storms, Fearful of Water, Sailors and the Harvest Walburga was a daughter of Richard, an early king of England (also a saint), and grew up to give her life to God. She became a nun and spent her time with a few companions, converting pagans in what is now Germany. She died in Germany at the age of sixty-nine after a successful lifetime of spreading the Word of the Lord. Her relics were moved on May 1, the date of a pagan festival that celebrates the beginning of the summer. She is also represented with three ears of corn, which may be one of the reasons she is the patroness against famine and for good harvests.

St. Walburga, servant of the Lord our God, Your prayers to God are clear and strong. I ask that you pray for a good season for our farmers And that the world maintains a plentiful supply of food. I ask God to bless all who are hungry, especially the children. Please provide those in need with the tools and means to survive. Teach us how to make the most of God's bounty So famine may disappear from the face of this wonderful earth. Amen.


