#### THE VINE AND THE BRANCHES

Reflection on John 15:1-8

Scripture provides us with some compelling images of the Church. St. Paul gives us the image of the "Body of Christ," and today, John the Evangelist expands on the metaphor of "the vine and the branches."

This image comes to my mind at every Mass, when the priest invites us to pray the Lord's Prayer with the words: "Taught by our Savior's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say..." It is that word, "formed," that is key. We are formed, equipped – that is to say "pruned" – for discipleship, for "bearing fruit" through our encounter with God's Word and reception of the Eucharist at Mass.

Jesus says, "You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to you." This pruning / forming / equipping is an ongoing process, an ever-deepening experience of taking into ourselves the likeness of Christ, so that we can "remain" in Him. Every moment, every day, every season of life presents us with new opportunities to bear fruit for the gospel. So we are continually being pruned – which doesn't always feel nice, since as the image implies, there may need to be some cutting that needs to happen for our fruit to be edible and our lives to be God-glorifying.

#### SAINTS PHILIP AND JAMES

Feast Day: May 3 • Patron Saints of Uruguay

James, Son of Alphaeus: We know nothing of this man except his name, and, of course, the fact that Jesus chose him to be one of the 12 pillars of the New Israel, His Church.

Philip: Philip came from the same town as Peter and Andrew, Bethsaida in Galilee. Jesus called him directly, whereupon he sought out Nathanael and told him of the "one about whom Moses wrote" (Jn 1:45).

Like the other apostles, Philip took a long time coming to realize who Jesus was. On one occasion, when Jesus saw the great multitude following Him and wanted to give them food, He asked Philip where they should buy bread for the people to eat. Saint John comments, "[Jesus] said this to test him, because he himself knew what he was going to do" (Jn 6:6). Philip answered, "Two hundred days' wages worth of food would not be enough for each of them to have a little [bit]" (Jn 6:7).

Possibly because Philip bore a Greek name or because he was thought to be close to Jesus, some gentile proselytes came to him and asked him to introduce them to Jesus. Philip went to Andrew, and Andrew went to Jesus. Jesus' reply in John's Gospel is indirect; Jesus says that now His "hour" has come, that in a short time He will give His life for Jew and Gentile alike.

As in the case of the other apostles, we see in James and Philip human men who became foundation stones of the Church, and we are reminded again that holiness and its consequent apostolate are entirely the gift of God, not a matter of human achieving. All power is God's power, even the power of human freedom to accept His gifts. "You will be clothed with power from on high," Jesus told Philip and the others. Their first commission had been to expel unclean spirits, heal diseases, announce the kingdom. They learned, gradually, that these externals were sacraments of an even greater miracle inside their persons—the divine power to love like God.



# Test God's Generosity!

St. Joan of Arc is a tithing Parish Family who knows that all we have is gifted from God in the first place. Tithing is the practice of trusting God's promise and giving back to God first. The Lord established this spiritual exercise and trained His people how to become sound, joyful and free by giving to God first ("The tithes of the herd and the flock, every tenth animal that passes under the herdsman's rod, shall be sacred to the LORD." Leviticus 27:32; "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, That there may be food in my house. Put me to the test, says the LORD of hosts, And see if I do not open the floodgates of heaven for you, and pour down upon you blessing without measure!" Malachi 3:10).

All the faithful are directed by God to offer 10% of our "increase" (income) to the Lord. It is a profound counter-cultural statement of our gratitude to God and acknowledges our total dependence on Him from whom we have received all that is good in the first place.

# May Crowning

St. Joan of Arc's annual **May Procession and May Crowning** will take place this Sunday, May 2, 2021, between the two morning Masses. We gather to honor Mary, the Patroness of our country, as we crown the Queen of Angels during a devotional service presented by our elementary faith formation students and the Legion of Mary. We invite family and friends to share in this devotion, and we ask all to bring flowers from their gardens that day to honor Our Lady of Grace.

During the month of May -- a month named for and dedicated to Mary -- Catholics around the world traditionally honor Our Blessed Mother with special devotional services like our May Crowning. The tradition in the United States and many other countries has been for school children to participate in a "May Crowning" ceremony, with a procession of students -- girls wearing pretty spring dresses and boys in their "Sunday best." During the service, a wreath of flowers is placed on a statue of Mary.

Our devotional ceremony begins with a procession of the elementary students, which includes our parish's First Communicants (dressed in their First Communion dresses and suits). We will have special readings, songs and prayers to honor Our Blessed Mother. She will be crowned with a wreath of fresh flowers.



# Faith Formation






