### **SACRAMENTS**

*Infant Baptism:* Celebrated on the second and fourth weekend of each month; Saturday at 3:00 p.m. or Sunday following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Deacon Jim (757-898-5570). Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

*Confirmation:* This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the RCIA process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated with a personal visit to a home or care facility so that family and friends may be present.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

### **CREATED TO BE IN RELATIONSHIP**

Reflection on Mark 10:2-16

Someone once said that if there are two things that almost everyone knows about the Catholic Church, they are the Church's stance on divorce and its teaching on abortion. The last time this Gospel came around on Sunday, I happened to be traveling and attended Mass as a worshipper rather than a presider. The priest, in his homily, harangued on about the evils of divorce, without any word of compassion or understanding for anyone in the assembly, or their families, who have experienced divorce. Even I, who have three divorced siblings, felt judged and more than a little upset.

Relationships in general, and the marriage relationship in particular, are too complex and rich and difficult and life-giving and holy to attempt to use this Gospel passage alone to portray the faithfulness to which God calls each of us. We are created to be in relationship. Whether we are single or married, divorced or remarried, all of us must live and grow through intimate and nourishing relationships to be fully human.

This is our blessedness, and just as Jesus welcomed the little children in His embrace, so He gathers each of us, whatever our past, into His presence and into relationships with others to strengthen us.

### ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI

Feast Day: October 4 • Patron Saint of Animals, Archaeologists and Italy

The patron saint of Italy, Francis of Assisi was a poor little man who astounded and inspired the Church by taking the gospel literally—not in a narrow fundamentalist sense, but by actually following all that Jesus said and did, joyfully, without limit, and without a sense of self-importance.

From the cross in the neglected field-chapel of San Damiano, Christ told him, "Francis, go out and build up my house, for it is nearly falling down." He must have suspected a deeper meaning to "build up my house." But he would have been content to be for the rest of his life the poor "nothing" man actually putting brick on brick in abandoned chapels. He gave up all his possessions, piling even his clothes before his earthly father—who was demanding restitution for Francis' "gifts" to the poor. A few people began to realize that this man was actually trying to be Christian. He really believed what Jesus said: "Announce the kingdom! Possess no gold or silver or copper in your purses, no traveling bag, no sandals, no staff" (Luke 9:1-3).

Francis was torn between a life devoted entirely to prayer and a life of active preaching of the Good News. He decided in favor of the latter, but always returned to solitude when he could. During the last years of his relatively short life, he died at 44, Francis was half blind and seriously ill.

# Faith Formation




