**SACRAMENTS**Infant Baptism: Normally celebrated on a Saturday at 3:00 p.m. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Holy Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Jennifer Strash (757-898-5570) to schedule. Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates may be adjusted due to holidays. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

**Confirmation:** This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the OCI process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated in the Parish Office or with a personal visit to a home or care facility.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until after meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

## The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass

Christ is always present to His Church, especially in the actions of the liturgy. He is present in the Sacrifice of the Mass, in the person of the minister (it is the same Christ who formerly offered Himself on the cross that now offers by the ministry of priests) and most of all under the Eucharistic species. He is present in the Sacraments by His power, in such a way that when someone baptizes, Christ Himself baptizes. He is present in His Word, for it is He Himself who speaks when the holy Scriptures are read in the Church. Finally, He is present when the Church prays and sings, for He Himself promised:

Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there in their midst.

(Sacrosanctum Concilium, nn. 7-8. 106)

#### **BEING HEARD**

Reflection on Mark 10:46-52

We often consider Jesus' question: "Who do you say that I am?" as the most important question for would-be followers ever posed in the New Testament. Certainly, each of us must answer this question not only in the course of what we believe about Jesus but also in how we go about living our lives.

But perhaps today's question posed to Bartimaeus from Jesus: "What do you want me to do for you?" is equally, if not even more significant for disciples.

When Jesus tells Bartimaeus that his faith has saved him, perhaps He was referencing the beggar's persistence, his determination to find his voice and make it heard, his insistence that carrying his desires/prayers to Jesus in personal encounter will surely result in a showering of grace, his courage in going against the "many" who just want him to go away and stop irritating them.

When Jesus encounters the faith of Bartimaeus, and when He encounters our faith, He stresses that we are first and last His beloved children. May you know, in the depth of your being, that you are loved by God. When we have this gift, we can approach the Divine as a child, with any request, and we will be heard.

#### **SAINT MARTIN DE PORRES**

Saint of the Day: November 3

Patron Saint of: African Americans, Barbers, Hairdressers,

Race Relations, Radio, Social Justice

Martin was the son of a freed woman of Panama and a Spanish grandee of Lima, Peru. Martin inherited the features and dark complexion of his mother. His parents never married. After the birth of a sister, his father abandoned the family. Martin was reared in poverty. Even as a child, he gave his heart and his goods to the poor and despised. When he was 12, his mother apprenticed him to a barber-surgeon. He learned to cut hair and also to care for wounds, treat illness, and prepare and administer medicines.

Martin applied to the Dominicans to be a "lay helper," not feeling worthy to be a religious brother. After nine years of prayer, penance, charity and humility, the community requested that he make full religious profession. Many of his nights were spent in prayer and penance; his days were filled with caring for the sick and the poor, regardless of their color, race, or status. He was instrumental in founding an orphanage, caring for slaves brought from Africa, and became the procurator for both priory and city.

Side by side with his daily work, Martin's life reflected God's extraordinary gifts: ecstasies that lifted him into the air, light filling the room where he prayed, bilocation, miraculous knowledge, instantaneous cures, and a remarkable rapport with animals. He would excuse the raids of mice and rats, and he kept stray cats and dogs at his sister's house.

A formidible fundraiser, he obtained thousands of dollars for dowries so that poor girls could marry or enter a convent. Many of his religious fellows took Martin as their spiritual director, but he continued to call himself a "poor slave."
