MY BELOVED SON


Reflection on Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

The Baptism of Jesus goes to the center of the mystery of redemption and of what Jesus' mission on earth is all about. There is also a special irony here, for in His Baptism Jesus enters into a radical solidarity with all women and men, taking upon Himself even the condition of our own sinfulness, Himself having not sinned. In going into those waters of Baptism, you and I leave sin behind, whereas Jesus takes on all the sin of the human race, and from those waters is sent by the Father on His mission to accomplish this redemption for us.

We too are sent on mission from the waters of Baptism. The Father proclaims to each of us, as He did to Jesus, "You are my beloved son, my beloved daughter...," reminding us, now that original sin has been wiped away, of the original blessing of all creation: God looked upon it and pronounced it all good! Grace, which is present "always and everywhere," is more powerful than sin.

Our baptismal journey involves leaving behind the binary way of the world (either/or) to live in the grace of Oneness with God. This is a both/ and journey where God is present in every human experience: weakness and strength, suffering and wholeness, life and death. Grace everywhere and in everything abounds!

SAINT MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS

Saint of the Day: January 12

Patron Saint of Poverty, Loss of Parents and People Rejected by Religious Orders "God closes a door and then opens a window," people sometimes say when dealing with their own disappointment or someone else's. That was certainly true in Marguerite's case. Children from European as well as Native American backgrounds in 17th-century Canada benefited from her great zeal and unshakable trust in God's providence.

Born the sixth of 12 children in Troyes, France, Marguerite at the age of 20 believed that she was called to religious life. Her applications to the Carmelites and Poor Clares were unsuccessful. A priest friend suggested that perhaps God had other plans for her.

In 1654, the governor of the French settlement in Canada visited his sister, an Augustinian canoness in Troyes. Marguerite belonged to a sodality connected to that convent. The governor invited her to come to Canada and start a school in Ville-Marie (eventually the city of Montreal). When she arrived, the colony numbered 200 people with a hospital and a Jesuit mission chapel.

Soon after starting a school, she realized her need for coworkers. Returning to Troyes, she recruited a friend, Catherine Crolo, and two other young women. In 1667, they added classes at their school for Indian children. A second trip to France three years later resulted in six more young women and a letter from King Louis XIV, authorizing the school. The Congregation of Notre Dame was established in 1676 but its members did not make formal religious profession until 1698 when their Rule and constitutions were approved.

Marguerite established a school for Indian girls in Montreal. At the age of 69, she walked from Montreal to Quebec in response to the bishop's request to establish a community of her sisters in that city. Marguerite was canonized in 1982.
