### **SACRAMENTS**

*Infant Baptism:* Normally celebrated on a Saturday at 3:00 p.m. Baptisms also may be celebrated during Holy Mass (except during Holy Week). Please contact Jennifer Strash (757-898-5570) to schedule. Parents are required to complete a Baptismal Preparation session prior to a Baptism; these are presented on the first weekend of January, March, May, July, September and November following the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Session dates may be adjusted due to holidays. Session dates and location will be posted in the bulletin.

**Confirmation:** This Sacrament fortifies us in the power of the Holy Spirit for a full experience of human living. Confirmation is conferred normatively upon teens in their sophomore year or through the OCI process for all those, children or adults, who are converting into the fullness of the Catholic faith. Sincere preparation must precede the reception of this beautiful Sacrament.

Anointing of the Sick: The Sacrament of the sick may be received after weekday or weekend Masses with prior notice. The Sacrament may also be celebrated in the Parish Office or with a personal visit to a home or care facility.

**Sacrament of Marriage:** Couples called to the Sacrament of Marriage should contact the Parish Office at least 6 months prior to the desired wedding date. Please make no firm arrangements until after meeting with the Deacon/Priest.

### **JESUS IS THE LIGHT**


Reflection on 1 Corinthians 12:12-30 and Luke 4:14-21

About 50 AD, Paul of Tarsus arrived unceremoniously in Corinth. His preaching had so riled the Thessalonians that his fellow Christians hustled him out of town for safety. After an unsuccessful stint in Athens, Paul drifted into Corinth, a vibrant port notorious for immorality, where he found fertile soil and worked there for many months. But after his departure, problems exploded, and he engaged them in a lengthy, sometimes angry correspondence to solve them.

Paul begs the Corinthians, in the name of Jesus, that there be no factions among them. For it is evident that the reported "quarreling" in the church at Corinth was based upon divergent commitments to someone or something other than Jesus.

In Luke's Gospel, after announcing His mission today in His hometown of Nazareth, Jesus will leave Nazareth for Capernaum to commence and fulfill the promise of bringing Light. This is always and forever, for the Church in every age and place, what unifies us as Christ's Body: Jesus is the Light in the darkness! Centered in Christ, we can overcome all divisions, and bring that same Light to the world.

### **SAINT THOMAS AQUINAS**

Saint of the Day: January 28

Patron Saint of Catholic Colleges, Teachers, Philosophers, Students

Thomas Aquinas is the preeminent spokesman of the Catholic tradition of reason and of divine revelation. He is one of the great teachers of the medieval Catholic Church, honored with the titles Doctor of the Church and Angelic Doctor.

At five he was given to the Benedictine monastery at Monte Cassino. In 1239, he was sent to Naples to complete his studies. It was here that he was first attracted to Aristotle's philosophy.

By 1243, Thomas abandoned his family's plans and joined the Dominicans to his mother's dismay. On her order, Thomas was captured by his brother and kept at home.

Once free, he went to Paris and Cologne, finished his studies with Albert the Great, held two professorships in Paris, lived at the court of Pope Urban IV, directed the Dominican schools at Rome and Viterbo, combated adversaries of the mendicants, as well as the Averroists, and argued with Franciscans about Aristotelianism.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith, of reason and human knowledge, pervades his work. One might expect him to be an ardent defender of revealed truth, but he was able to see the whole natural order as coming from God the Creator, and reason as a divine gift to be highly cherished.

The Summa Theologiae, his uncompleted last work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology. He stopped work on it after celebrating Mass on December 6, 1273. He said, "I cannot go on...All that I have written seems to me like so much straw compared to what I have seen and what has been revealed to me." He died March 7, 1274.
